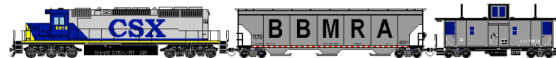

## May Program: John Bower - Putting together Antique Wooden Car Kits

Assembling some of the older kits for rolling stock or buildings can be a lot of work and require some special precautions, but it is well worth the effort. You have something on your layout which most people don't have on theirs and an appreciation of the pioneers of the model railroading hobby.

Our speaker May 15 at Myers Park Community Center is John Bower, who will talk about modeling with old wood and paper kits. The pieces must be sealed inside and outside and special steps are necessary to preserve dry transfer decals which may be 50 years old.

The HO collection donated to the club by Don Boudreau's family include about 20 old kits from Ambroid and other companies. We will be offering some of these for sale to club members. Don't miss John's talk if you are interested in one of these old kits.

As with the first "Garage Sale," we ask that only model train "stuff" be sold. The sale will be open to the general public. Admission will be free. We will advertise in the Tallahassee Democrat and Tallahassee Advertiser.
