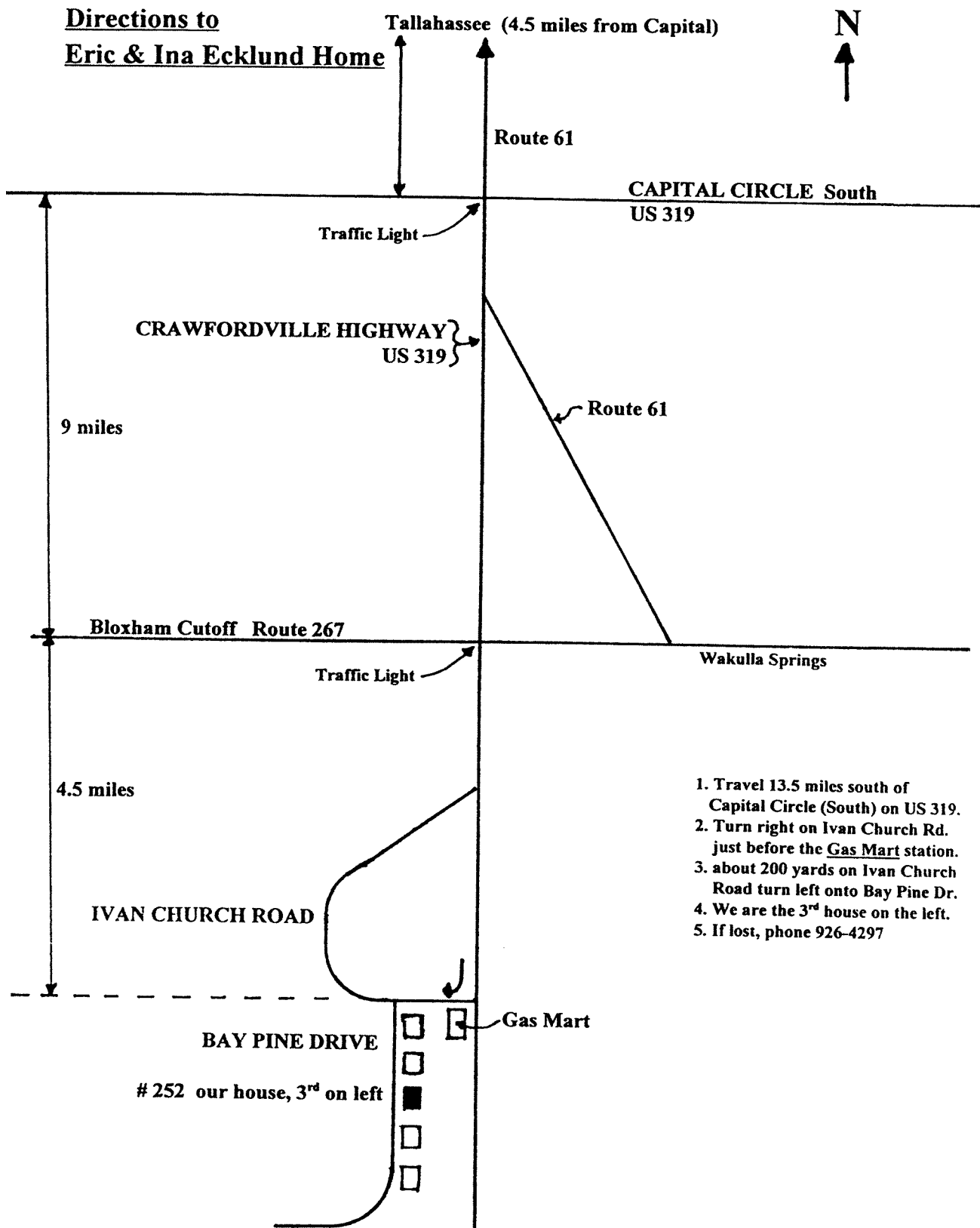

THE FOLKSTON FUNNEL- By Larry Benson: There are trains a plenty, enough to satisfy even the most avid railfan, at the Folkston Funnel located not far from Tallahassee in southeast Georgia. I'm told around 60 trains pass through CSX's double-track main line including Amtrak and the famous Tropicana Juice Train. At a "Y" where the tracks diverge - one running north along the east coast and the other northwest towards Waycross.

On the third weekend in March, Shirley and I were on our way to the tiny port city of St. Mary's situated in the northeast corner of Georgia. A quick look at our maps showed we could plan our route through Folkston. I had been with other BMMRA members on our way home from GATS in Jacksonville, but it got dark while we shivered watching trains roll by.

The stopover would be even more fun on a warm sunny day. And, so it was on a clear, blue-sky Saturday we extended our trip long enough to enjoy some railroading. We bought "whoppers" and drinks at Burger King the next morning and took the short blocks to the Funnel overlook. I say "overlook" because there sits a huge covered, platform elevated area where watchers can perch for a superb unobstructed view of passing trains.

Seating areas on this spacious deck include ceiling fans, lights, lawn chairs, and a radio scanner sound system over which you can hear the work between trains, dispatchers and defect detectors located up and down the line. Also, there is a schedule of route maps and small shelves mounted on the support posts where visitors can stand to eat. Right next to the overlook are limited parking spaces, a picnic table, charcoal grill and garbage can. What else could a train buff want for a day's course.

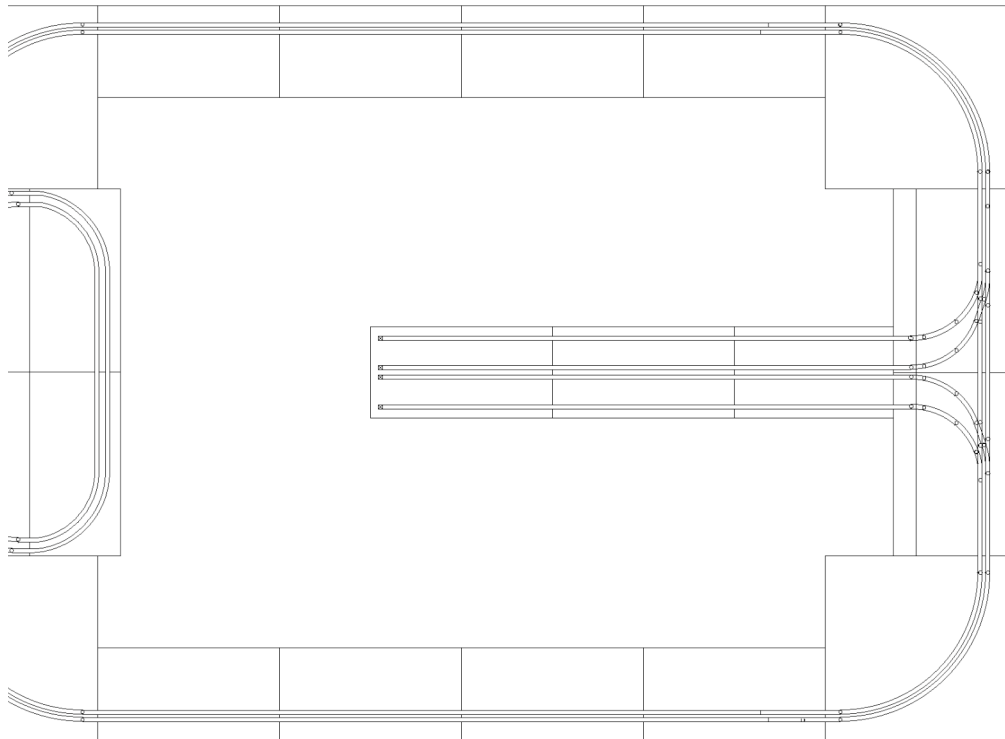
For hours, we gawked at six freights being towed by diesels painted in three different colors: CSX, Union Pacific and Norfolk Southern. The last two were surprises because I expected most all locomotive power to be that of CSX.

Just north of the tracks to the south, nestled under gigantic oak trees dressed in Spanish moss, is the restored A.C.L. depot. It is closed so we couldn't go inside.

The drive from Tallahassee to Folkston takes less than three hours. Take I-10 east to exit 335 at MacClenny. Follow I-10 north for 42 miles through St. George to Folkston. The highway is 2-lanes wide, smooth with very little traffic. Just north of Folkston, you'll cross the tracks and see the Funnel on your right a block away.
