Maxine Mantooth hopes Roy will be able to come home by the end of this month, as he continues his slow, but steady recovery from the acute pancreatic attack he suffered on January 2.

Roy was hospitalized at Tallahassee Memorial Regional Medical Center for a month, had some very serious problems, had his gall bladder removed and faced other serious conditions which were finally successfully treated. He was transferred a week ago to HealthSouth, a rehabilitation hospital.

He already is making a list of the first 100 things he will do when he returns to his train room again. I am certain he will want to resume the Old-timers meetings the first Monday of the month as soon as possible. It probably will be April, but that seems a reasonable goal. Maybe one of you other fellows will host it for March.

Roy can have visitors at HealthSouth, although the weekday hours are limited, from 4 to 8 p.m. They are a little more flexible on Saturday afternoons and Sunday afternoons, although the official hours remain 4 to 8. If you sign in, they usually don't say anything.

He is, as of this writing (February 6) in Room 106. He is still weak, but eating normal food, although not as much as Maxine would like. He does physical therapy (Roy is not really into exercising) much of the weekday.

The train club's support of Roy has been wonderful, through prayers, visits, food, and other kindness. You are truly appreciated. Thank you.

The model can be submitted in person or by proxy. Detailed contest rules will be published in the March Lantern. NMRA judging criteria can be downloaded from the NMRA website.

Hobbytown has agreed to sponsor a plaque and certificate for the award. The first one will be presented, hopefully by Roy himself, at the SSR convention May 18-20 at the Hilton Inn Ocala.

BBMRA members should plan on attending both to show our support for Roy and because of the many excellent clinics planned, especially when the SSR convention is this close to Tallahassee. # Minutes of January 2007 BBMRA Membership Meeting

**Treasurer's Report:** Bill Boyle reported a balance of \$3089.00. A draft zero based budget was distributed by Treasurer Bill Boyle for information. The new Board will prepare a budget for presentation and adoption at the February meeting. An issue on dues reduction was discussed by the board and it was decided that the dues are not excessive and will remain \$20.00 a year.

#### **Division Reports:**

**N Scale:** Garth Easton made a motion that the N-Scale Division be changed to small scale so as to include Z-scale. Included in the motion was a requirement to change the bylaws. Motion was seconded and accepted.

**HO Scale:** HO division will meet after the elections to elect a coordinator and discuss future events.

Large Scale: The large scale division hoped to purchase a Polar Express from Dillard's but was unsuccessful.

**Veteran's Memorial – Bristol:** John Anthamatten and Tom Keenan reported that the Christmas runs were successful. They should get the Notice to Proceed on the grant from DOT by the end of the month. They hope to build a trestle, more engine coverings and more tracks. They also reported that they had several HO circus displays if anyone was interested in building them.

#### Good of the Group Comments, Etc.:

Guests: New members included the Swans and Bill Bell.

**Albany Show**: We have a reciprocal admittance agreement with the Flint River Model Railroad Club and our members will be admitted free. Discussion was held and it was decided that a roster of last year's members plus new members will be sent to them by John Sullenberger.

Sal Martocci reported on a live steam meeting he attended.

Barrett Johnson reported that 26 scouts received model railroading merit badges last year. He also reported on a Prototype Rails clinic he attended. Prototype Rails is an annual meeting in Cocoa Beach of modelers, almost entirely HO, interested in strict adherence to every detail of the prototype. For example, one of these modelers models the Yosemite Valley Railroad--as it was in August, 1939 so that the grass color is correct and the cars correspond to what the RR actually ran that time of year. The clinics are filled with detailed information and techniques and there is good support from manufacturers.

Sam reported that Roy Mantooth is still in intensive care in TMH. Recovery will be slow but it is possible that he may not recover. Sam was recognized by the membership for his almost daily updates via E-Mail.

Joe Haley reported that he is in the process of getting sound engines on the switching yard.

#### Program:

Elections were held for the 2007 year. Candidates for each position were as follows: President – Barrett Johnson, Vice President – John Sullenberger, Secretary – Lyn Heath and Treasurer – Bill Boyle. As a member of the nominating committee, David Brazell conducted the election. The floor was opened for nominating any other candidates. There were none. Motion was made, seconded and accepted that nominations be closed. Motion was made, seconded and accepted that the candidates be accepted in their respective positions by acclamation. Outgoing Vice President Randy Lombardo gave a farewell address thanking members for his opportunity to serve.

# Children's Day 2007 - A Salute to Holidays in Florida

While skies were filled with thin puffy white clouds, the sun peaking in and out, with a wisp of wind in the air, many children in winter's wear gathered round because on this day this was their special playground.

While most members were in Georgia, two were in Tallahassee at the R. A. Gray Building "running trains" at the 2007 Children's Day Festival. "Yardmaster" Joe Haley and I entered the Museum of Florida History with our wares for the Big Bend Model Railroad display. Two tables and four chairs were assigned to us and we mutually agreed to use one table each plus one chair would accommodate adults of kids wishing to have a seat.

Two scales were represented, Joe's was the HO-Scale Timesaver switching layout, while I set-up an O-27 Lionel layout. While Joe had all the necessary equipment, I only had the Thomas the Tank engine set from last year. However, the choices weren't limited and I would either use the Lionel Fastrack (O-36) that was included or some Lionel postwar tubular track (cataloged 1942-1969). I chose the later since the standard 80 watt transformer was wired in this manner and I brought an extra lock-on to complete the electrical connection.

Young and old were excited as Thomas (a 0-6-0 engine), was let out of the box and placed on the track along with coaches "Annie" and "Clarabelle" for their second debut! Two Lionel structures were also added: a station platform (cataloged 1985-1987) and a worn American flagpole kit (cataloged 1983-1987). Meanwhile, Joe placed his buildings and matchbox trucks from the 1960's on the layout and we were ready to "Run Trains" shortly after 11:30 AM.

The younger crowd and some teenagers with parents in tow lined-up between other activities to take as many turns as they wanted operating Thomas, who had a mind of his own operating either forwards, backwards or not at all due to a loose wire. Despite this little bug, it didn't deter anyone from visiting the well-known engine. The object was to operate Thomas for a while then stop him at the collapsible station platform (think Florida and its hurricanes), where three figures were preparing to board: a conductor, an engineer and Sir Topham Hat ("the boss of the railroad"), which kids and parents recognized immediately. Speaking with many children and parents (several couldn't stay a way and hung around nearly an hour) about future plans for the layout (Percy, a 0-4-0 engine) and whether Thomas had a bell or not; he doesn't.

Joe had little bugs too; the Rock Island switcher and transformer were bad-ordered (malfunctioning) and were replaced by a Pennsylvania railroad switcher and another transformer. As "Yardmaster" or "Yard boss", he instructed the person after placing a CSX hardhat on his/her head to pick-up loaded freight cars at one end of the layout and deliver then to their final destination through many switches; a "Junior Engineer" certificate was awarded if they performed satisfactory.

Towards tear-down time, Joe went for lunch, while I ate mine during the hours of operation. I finally had the opportunity to briefly view the other activities taking place and created a souvenir 2007 button. Shortly after 4:00 PM, we dismantled the layouts and as I was exiting the building, a little girl talking to her parents exclaimed, "There's the trainman!" Joe and I certainly were if only for one day.

Many thanks to the staff and volunteers of the Museum of Florida History, who provided lunch and let our club participate in this annual event.
