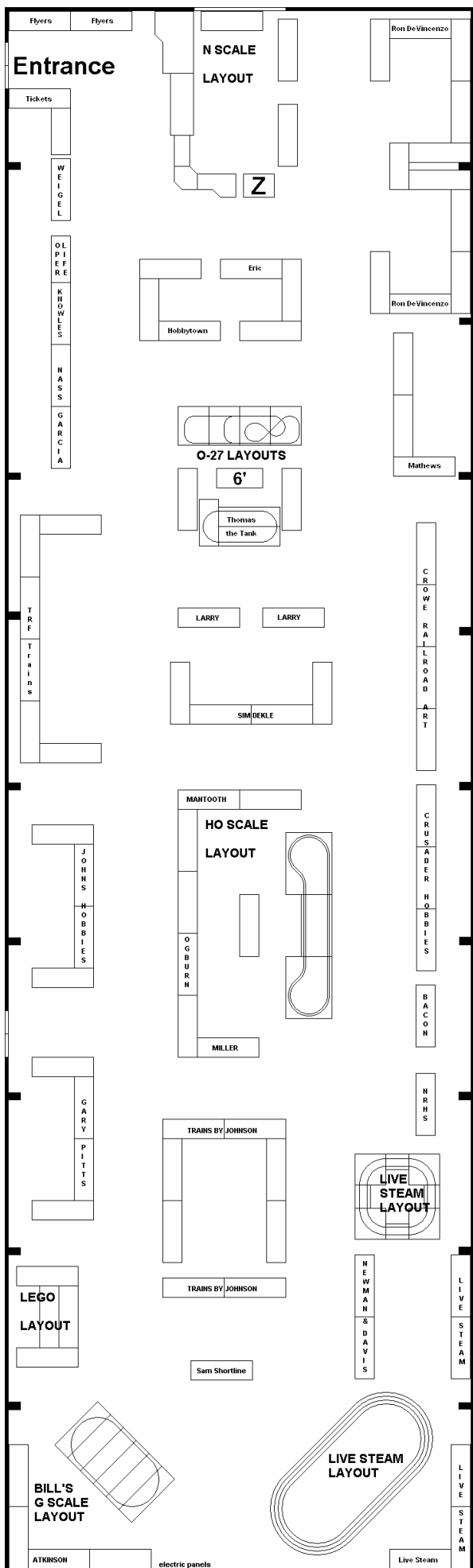
Activities include:

- Veterans Memorial Railroad in Bristol, east of Tallahassee. Veterans is a 24-inch gauge railway park featuring the only coal-fired, live steam locomotive operating in a public park in Florida.
- DeVoe Moore's Antique Car and Railroad Museum. Mr. Moore has acquired one of the world's largest collection of antique cars and has devoted much of the second floor to model railroading and prototype railroading memorabilia.
- HO and N Scale operating sessions.
- Saturday lunch special- good food and operations by the Tallahassee's Live Steamers.
- Workshops, contests and a swap meet.
- A special banquet speaker - someone from Tallahassee's political or lobbying community.
- A Sunday morning tour of Tallahassee area layouts, including Eric Ecklund's garden railroad, one of the finest in the country.

Spouse activities will include a tour of Florida's 22-story Capitol and lunch at Wakulla Springs, a historic early Florida tourist attraction and now a state park. We also are exploring a visit to the Governor's Mansion.

Ramada room rates are \$79 a night. We expect our banquet and registration costs to be similar to Gulf Coast Express III. We will begin registrations and hotel reservations this fall, through the Sunshine Region internet site and invitations by mail if you will complete the attached pre-registration form.
