Broadway Limited Imports was the first company to offer sound and remote control equipped HO trains, and won the [Model Railroader](#) Magazine 2002 and 2003 Product of the Year and HO Model of the Year awards. Mr. Zimet and Mr. Wenzel sold their shares to Mr. Grubba in 2004 and the company was moved to Ormond Beach, Florida.

Monticello

The Hub of Rail Activity ? By Mike Sassard and Bob Moody

Recently, in doing some research on the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad, I came across the following paragraph from the Internet.

In 1928 the ACL completed a line between [Perry, Florida](#) and Drifton, near [Monticello, Florida](#), the last link of the new "Perry Cut-off". This created a more direct route between Chicago and Florida's west coast, one which passed through Macon, Albany, and Thomasville, the route followed by ACL's passenger train *The Southland* from December 1928 to 1957 when it was rerouted to Jacksonville.

Upon remembering a conversation I had with our own Bob Moody, I sent him the information. He replied with information which I believe to be more accurate:

"The "Southland" service thru Monticello ended in the late 50's. I rode it from Macon to Monticello in I think 1959 just months before it ended,

"I am sending a photo of the station at that time. It was located about a mile or so west of town on US 90 called 'New Monticello'.

"This is the only picture known to have survived the years

"I have been checking on the dates for the "Southland"

"I was in an auto accident on Easter Sunday 1957.....I was in a neck cast until early August.....I remember going up to Macon to visit my folks and taking the train back.....we moved to Ft Worth in August 1957.



"The termination of service could have been late 1957....but, there is some evidence that it ran until late 1959."

Bob sent me a splendid picture of the station. As you can see it clearly says "Monticello". I believe the Internet is in error here.

Here is a picture of the L and N *Southland*.
