23rd Annual Wiregrass Model Railroad Show and Sale

The 23rd annual Wiregrass Model Railroad Show and Sale will be held at the National Peanut Festival Fairgrounds (5622 US Highway 231) just south of Dothan, Alabama on Saturday, September 21st and Sunday, September 22nd. Show hours on Saturday are 9 am to 5 pm CDT and on Sunday are 10 am to 4 pm CDT. The show will feature vendors from throughout the Southeast selling model train equipment and supplies and operating model railroads in several scales. The show also will feature an outdoor train ride for children, concessions and door prizes on both days. The non-profit show is sponsored by the Wiregrass Heritage Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society. Admission is \$5 for adults and free for children under age 12.

Remember, the BBMRA has a reciprocal show entrance agreement with the Wiregrass Chapter and BBMRA members get in free.
