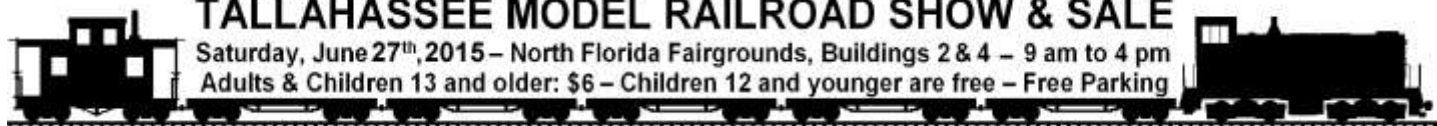

BBMRA Leads Area Boy Scout Railroading Merit Badge Program

The Boy Scout railroading merit badge program is alive and well in Tallahassee. Since Barrett Johnson began to head up the local program in 2002, 207 Scouts have earned the badge through classes conducted by BBMRA members.



Joe Haley, our tireless Timesaver operator, Sam Miller, Roy Mantooth, Bill Boyle and others have worked with Barrett to make the program prosper. The most recent merit badge class was taught by Sam and Barrett February 7, for troops in the Tallahassee area sponsored by the Church of Latter Day Saints. It included 25

Scouts, more than the average for an entire year.

To earn the badge, Scouts must read the railroading merit badge book. There are also several other requirements, typically involving a choice among several alternatives. BBMRA teaches the course in roughly the same way it is

taught at the Boy Scout National Jamboree. We begin with a 15-minute Q&A so Scouts can show they have read the book and met other requirements. The Scouts are then divided into two groups. While one group builds a car from an Athearn blue box kit and then weathers it, the other group operates the Timesaver. The Scouts buy the kits; Barrett furnishes the tools and weathering supplies. When both groups are done, the Scouts then have a weathered car to take home.

Serving as a railroading merit badge counselor also helps modelers who are NMRA members. Railroading merit badge counselors get credit for every month they serve, plus credit for each Scout they counsel, which makes serving as a counselor the fastest and easiest way to earn the Association Volunteer Achievement Award. Earn that, plus another six from the remaining 10, and the NMRA member becomes a Master Model Railroader. MMR is quite a distinction; fewer than 500 have ever been awarded, most of them in the United States. NMRA--the National Model Railroad Association--is actually quite a misnomer. NMRA has divisions in Canada, Great Britain, Europe, Japan, Australasia and a working agreement with China that they will follow NMRA standards.

Barrett has served twice as president of the Suwannee River Area Boy Scout Council (Tallahassee region). He is vice chair of the NMRA's National Railroading Merit Badge Committee. Bill is a Suwannee Area Council employee. Sam is an Eagle Scout.
