## Northeast GA Lionel Shop Joining BBMRA's June 27 Show & Sale

BBMRA President Andy Zimmerman is contacting former and potential new vendors for the Tallahassee Model Railroad Show & Sale, Saturday, June 27. Andy has picked up a major new participant, Memory Station of Wakinsville, Ga., near Athens, and commitments from many of our regulars.

"The BBMRA will be holding its 24th Annual show and sale and we want YOU to be one of our vendors! I am sure you have heard by now that our founding



member and show coordinator for these last 24 years passed away last fall. While John Sullenberger was indeed the cornerstone of the club and the show, he would want to see it succeed in spite of all that has happened and succeed we will," Andy wrote to vendors.

"Please take a minute to send the requested information so we can lock your reservation in place. It is vitally important that you do so. We need to get the contracts out to each of you and do not want you to miss out. This is going to be a great Show"

"We are on track for another great show," Andy says. "We have had cancellations, but also new vendors, including Memory Station." The major cancellation so far was Bill and Jean Hollash, of Riverview, near Tampa, who are closing their Lionel/o gauge business and retiring. The tables the Hollashes will no longer be using have been picked up by Memory Station."

"Despite rumors to the contrary this show will be bigger and better than ever," Andy continued in his communication with vendors. "More vendors, more displays, more tables and more layouts than ever before. And we have increased our square footage to bring the very best this area has to offer in model railroading.

Many of the model railroading dealers participating in Tallahassee shows in the past have committed to the 2015 show, Andy reports. These include Rich Lucibello, an American Flyer dealer from St. Petersburg; Tucker Train Supply from Pensacola, N & HO; TRST Trains from Melbourne, specializing in N Scale; Jay Leinbach, Tarpon Springs, HO, N & railroading books; and David Kirkland, Panama City.

The Miracle Strip Model Railroading Club in Panama City has asked for space for both its N Scale and HO layouts. There is request for space for a layout from Pensacola. Each of the BBMRA layouts will operate as well.

## **N Scalers, Time Saver Already Invited to 2016 Woodville Founders Day**

The club's N Scalers and the Time Saver operated during Woodville's Annual Founder's Day celebration February 28 and were asked to come back in 2016. Andy Zimmerman says three N scale modules and the Time Saver were operated before an enthusiastic crowd. Andy thinks 325 or so checked out the layout, during Founder's Day at the Woodville Branch Library and J. Lewis Hall Sr., Park. That is perhaps half the crowd for 2014, but it rained during much of the day.

Andy was assisted in the N Scale operations by Garth Easton, N Scale Coordinator, and Neal Meadows. Joey Haley operated the Time Saver/switching layout which he developed for our club years ago.

"The Founder's Day director asked us to come back next year and said they would provide us more space. We would like to operate all six modules of our main traveling layout," Andy says. "This is becoming a regular part of our activities plan for each year. It is great exposure for our club and the show this summer. A lot of people provided their contact information so we can remind them about the show."

Andy has been contacted by the Gadsden Historical Society about a club operating session and model train display in May at Greensboro. The location would be the "ANNR" Depot which has been preserved by the West Gadsden Railroad Society.

Sam, You asked us to let you know if we had home train layouts. Here is an overview photo of my home HO layout in Crawfordville. It loosely models selective memories of my hometown of Vestal, New York, and the Erie/Lackawanna RR which adjoined my parents' property.

It is four-by-eight-feet, with DCC on the outer track and DC on the inside, including the yard and sidings. I had the whole thing set up in DCC but my engines were too sensitive for the switches, so I just run DCC on the outside now.

All of the buildings are lighted and I'm getting ready to install remote switches. As does everybody, I have plans to expand it a bit. I'm toying with spatial aspects in my garage turned workshop/storage/train layout.

I have a PowerPoint presentation that shows everything and I have music to accompany it (Phoebe Snow Train Song by Utah Phillips).

## John Sykes: “Rail Yards Adapted to Models”

John Sykes, one of our outstanding club members, once again had done exhaustive research, this time into rail yards. John was the club's program February 17 and he used large printed sheets of arial views of the yards, along with an on screen computer display showing various buildings for operational needs. He showed a diagram of the largest yard in North Platte, Nebraska. The yard is 8-1/2 miles long. The kicker is, that would be 502 feet in HO if completely modeled”.

John was able to show how railroads needed to fit track into small spaces just as we do. They have used three-way turnouts and wyes' to save space, and we can too. Much more was shown than I can report here. Thanks John.
