BBMRA Stepped Up; Kept Annual Model Train Show Going

The kids were happy, responding to the most impressive operating layouts BBMRA has had in some time. Most vendors thought they did well and actually better than at some larger shows. The paid gate was down a little, but still substantial. The 24th annual Tallahassee Model Train Show & Sale, our first without John Sullenberger, was a good one because of hard work by Club President Andy Zimmerman, Show Coordinator Marc Beshara, other BBMRA officers and so many members of the club.

If John had still been with us, I am guessing he would have been happy and would have wondered where all of the extra help came from. "Despite the lower numbers, I was pleased and pleasantly surprised at the outcome, but I know we can probably do a little better," Andy says.

"I feel like we kept it together for 2015 and prepared ourselves for the 25th anniversary show. The handful of vendors I was able to chat with were happy with their sales. This year's show was a good first step towards understanding what we need to do next year," Marc says.

When John Sullenberger, our long-time president and annual show coordinator, and Sandy Scott, club treasurer, passed away within days of each other last fall, BBMRA was left reeling and scrambling to plan and conduct the 2015 show.

John had done so much himself over the years and it was difficult to find all of the records needed for this year. So much was in his head and based on his personal relationships with the various vendors.

So many stepped up, including Andy Zimmerman, who was suddenly president, March Beshara, suddenly show coordinator, Sheldon Harrison, suddenly vice president and Drew Hackmeyer, suddenly treasurer, secretary Drug Gyuricsko and the coordinators – N Scale's Garth Easton; HO's Art Wilson; and Large Scale's Sam Miller.

Drew and Andy directed an unprecedented Committee of the Whole meeting of BBMRA late last year where each member was asked to help the club reconstructed details plans to carry out the 24th annual show.

The final paid gate was 570 – with actual total admission estimated at about 1,000. This was down from the paid gate of 725 in 2014, which was the highest in the history of the show, and a ranking of eighth during the last 16 years. Most vendors said, however, they actually sold more than at previous shows. John had done so much himself over the years and it was difficult to find all of the records needed for this year. So much was in his head and based on his personal relationships with the various vendors.

“We attracted people who actually wanted to spend money, not just kick the tires, but actually buy things,” Andy says.

Visitors came from as far away as Connecticut and Pennsylvania, Andy noted after looking at a survey of show attendees conducted again this year. The visitors from the Northeast were in Tallahassee visiting family.

Most of the attendees came from within a 100-mile radius of

Tallahassee, although the survey turned up visitors from Atlanta, Mobile, Ala., and Tampa and Orlando.

A bit of information for you, Andy.

We made \$200 more at the Tallahassee show this year than the first day of the Tampa show two weeks ago. Tampa had 1,700 paid admissions the first day. and you said you had about 570 paid admissions yesterday. And we made about \$150 more this year than last year at your show (which was an all-time high of 725 paid attendance). Shows that you are doing something right!

We were very pleased.

Veterans Memorial RR's Tom Keenan Dies at 85

Tom had been a member of BBMRA for years and hosted special operating sessions for club members. We are saddened by his death in late June. Barrett Johnson in our club was a good friend of Tom and Gloria, Tom's widow. Barrett says he has been assured by Gloria that Veterans Memorial Railroad will continue full speed ahead.

This notice appeared in the Tallahassee Democrat:

TA Thomas Alphonse Keenan, Lt. Col. USAF (ret), age 85, went to be with the Lord on Monday, June 22nd, 2015.

Tom was born on Jan 13th, 1930 in Dubois, Pa to Donald Thomas and Mary Schalk Keenan. He spent his youth in Bradford, Pa and graduated from St. Bernard High School in 1947. He attended the US Coast Guard Academy, and in 1948, he joined the US Air Force. Following two years as an enlisted man in Washington, DC, he joined the Aviation Cadet program. He was commissioned in 1951 and spent the next 10 years on a SAC combat crew, then 15 years as an aircraft maintenance officer. During his military career, he was stationed in Texas, Oklahoma, Maine, Washington, Louisiana, Vietnam, Germany, Guam, and Michigan.

After "retiring" in 1975, he earned his Business degree and MBA from Louisiana Tech University, then worked as a venture capitalist, ran a business college, managed the county airport in Minden, La, taught flying, maintained seaplanes in Key West, and sold real estate in Boca Raton. After moving to Eastpoint, FL, he served one year as the director of the Florida Seafood Festival in Apalachicola.

In 1988, he married Gloria Jacobs and settled in Bristol, Fl. In 2002, with the assistance of countless others, he began development of the 2ft gauge railroad at Veterans Memorial Park in Bristol. The VMRR has become a regional attraction known for the Halloween and Christmas train rides. He and Gloria also travelled extensively.

He is survived by his wife Gloria; his former wife, Inis (Ed) Bultmann of Panama City; son, Tom Allen (Suzanne) Keenan of Fernandina Beach; daughter, Kathleen (Nick) Bahadirli of Panama City Beach; three step daughters, Jill (Wilson) Carraway of Thomasville, Ga., Joni (Donnie) Read of Bristol, and Jena Willis of Bristol FL, and grandchildren Jeremy, Alex, Evan, Paige, Ryan, Hali, Hunter, Riley, Summer and Jessica.

FEC Briefing BBMRA on All Aboard Florida

Florida East Coast Railway has agreed to make a presentation before BBMRA in September or October on All Aboard Florida. The speaker will be Rusty Roberts, All Aboard Florida Vice President of Government Relations

BBMRA's Sam Miller will work with Rusty to firm up the presentation. All Aboard Florida is a passenger rail service being built by the FEC to connect Orlando and Miami, using existing FEC track and new track to be built along State Road 528 between Cocoa and Orlando. All Aboard Florida will be the first time a privately owned company in the US has developed and operated express passenger rail system in over 100 years. The project will include stations in downtown Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach.

Thomas & Friends at WFSU Aug 1 - & BBMRA's TTE Layout

Randy Lombardo and other members of the Large Scale Division will be running Thomas the Tank Engine Lionel trains Saturday, August 1, during "Thomas and Friends" Day at WFSU studios near the FSU golf course. WFSU reports all available tickets were snapped up within eight hours.

Randy, Doug Gyuricsko and Sam Miller will operate the TTE Layout from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., which also are the hours of the WFSU event. Set-up is at 8 a.m. The studios, for Florida State University's radio and television stations, are located at 1600 Red Barber Plaza, Tallahassee, FL 32310

In the past, WFSU advertised Thomas Day on its Internet site and allowed parents and grandparents to register for tickets. "Before we promoted this year, we sent an email to our Summer Challenge people. Some of those parents ended up sharing the event, and it sold out in eight hours without any promotion!" says Becca Piers, Coordinator of Educational Outreach.


