Veterans RR Launching "Polar Bear Express"

Celebrate the Winter Holiday Season with the Polar Bear Express at Veterans Memorial Railroad in Bristol! Operating sessions begin December 3 and are nightly on the designated days from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Many of the trains will be powered by VMRR's two-foot gauge Crown Live Steam Locomotive, the only coal-fired live steam locomotive operating in a public park in Florida. The Crown will be running Friday, December 3; Thursday through Saturday, December 8-10; , Friday through Sunday, December 16-18; and Thursday and Friday, December 22-23.

Diesel trains will be running Friday, December 3; Friday & Saturday, December 9-10; Friday & Saturday, December 16-17; and Thursday and Friday, December 22-23.

Admission is \$8 for diesel trains and \$12 for steam trains. Children two and under ride free. The rides are about 25 minutes long around Veterans Memorial Park to and from the Tom Keenan Station.

TCA Southern Division Train Show; Jacksonville, Saturday, November 19

We invite everyone back to the Morocco Shrine Auditorium, 3800 St Johns Bluff Road S, Jacksonville. The location has very easy access off I-295 (the east side of the loop). We again will have operating layouts with at least five displays (maybe more) including clubs from Jacksonville, and another world debut, this time in 3-rail modular. This venue is well known in Jacksonville. We will utilize the Activity Building which has a separate entry in the rear of the facility with its own dedicated parking lots. It is fully handicapped accessible.

HOURS: 9 AM to TCA members only and to the public from 10 AM to 3 PM. Admission is our division standard of \$5.00/person with free admission to a child 12 and under when accompanied by an adult or any adult accompanied by a child 12 or under.

WORKSHOPS: This year we will be trying workshops for the first time. We will have a hands-on workshop on running trains with the Lionel TMCC/Legacy System by Jim Troutman of the Toy Train Collectors of Jacksonville. Those who participate will get the chance to see and try remote control. If you have been intimidated in the past by TMCC, this will show you how simple it is to hook up and operate.

Fair warning: it is easier than my Smart phone or my Comcast remote control and could lead to another purchase!

Did you know that you can even run your postwar or prewar trains (Marx, Lionel, Williams, MPC, Weaver, RMT, Hoge, Hornby, Carlisle & Finch, just about anybody) by remote control?

The local NMRA (National Model Railroad Association) has agreed to host two workshops. The first workshop, "Putting Track in Its Place," will look at railroad right of way and how water flow and drainage influences the location of drainage ditches and structures to drain water away from the railroad track. Information will include railroad typical standards for cuts and fills as well as drainage ditches. This will be presented by Richard Segall.

We have two possible topics for the second NMRA workshop, which will be decided based on the availability of instructors. Our first possible workshop topic is "Installing a Liftgate." The folks doing this one would bring their module with a liftgate that allows them to access the center without ducking under. The concept would be the same for a fixed layout. My knees vote for this one. The second possibility is a workshop on weathering (those who collect only Mint or Like New items avert your eyes). This will show the basics of making that bright, shiny, new Lionel look like a real locomotive or how to make that good to very good condition train look like a real one, dings and all, and rescue it from the projects drawer.

WORKSHOP TIMES are tentatively scheduled for 11:30, 12:00 AND 12:30.

DIRECTIONS: From I-295 East Beltway heading south, take the Beach Boulevard exit and turn right (west) and a quick left turn onto St. Johns Bluff Road South. From I-295 East Beltway heading north, take the Town Center Parkway / Univ of North Florida exit, turn left (west) and a quick right onto St. Johns Bluff Road heading north (you can't go south). The Morocco Shrine Auditorium has a very large sign and is a very prominent structure on the west side of St. Johns Bluff Road. Good location, trains, workshops, trains, shopping nearby, trains, dining, trains, close to the beach, trains, an open house. Did I mention trains?! Hope to see you in a few weeks.

It's not that I can't do scale scenery. I did at one time in my life. I was once a full fledge total scale modeler, HO and N. I know how. Been there, done that. It's now , I choose not to. Oddly, I absolutely abhor the Lionel and MTH trains painted up to represent baseball teams, NASCAR, etc. I was told these things sell and I don't understand why. I will only tolerate "Lionel Lines" and "American Flyer"

Possibly, some is due to age, 77. While I do not see the grim reaper around the corner, my body is telling me that I am no longer a spring chicken. This has caused me to be a little reflective over my past life, which has had its good moments. I tend to want things that are meaningful to me around me, sort of like a collection.

Some people collect stamps, coins, old cars (the wealthy), antiques and, of course, trains. I have never wanted to just collect trains. Although I used to belong to the Train Collectors Association, I ran what I bought. Yet earlier in life, and now too, I have had the feeling of , I have always wanted one of those. Standard gauge, Marx, American Flyer and so on.

Mostly I run what I collect, with one exception. My Marx Commodore Vanderbilt won't run, but I have it. Childhood memories. Lately I have been getting many of those memories. I do not like to display items on a shelf. I do have to put the overflow of O gauge trains on a shelf, now that I am mostly G gauge. I do not want to get rid of most of the O trains.

Another part of my scenery scheme is it all has to be nice. I use green grass indoor/outdoor carpet because I don't model brown grass, dirt, or fall trees. Hence the layout name Camelot. This explains all the castles and royalty. "In short, there's simply not a more convenient spot for happy everaftering than here in Camelot."

Simply put, This is Mike's World - a bit more complete than Disney World, but on a smaller scale (pun). This also blends in with my life philosophy. As Dan put it, "Livin' the dream , Baby, livin' the dream." Do it now, there's not much time left.

Metcalf Saw Mill Modeler's Dream Challenge

On Highway 59, on the way to Thomasville, north of Lloyd and Miccosukee and just above the Florida-Georgia line, is an interesting facility which could be modeled with animation by a skilled modeler. It's the Metcalf sawmill. One of the N Gauge layouts at the recent Dothan train show did feature a similar facility involving logs but not wood chips. It was animated and added considerable interest to the layout.

The facility in Metcalf represents a timber industry railroad interface. The large crane lifts logs which are turned into wood chips and then loaded into wood chip railroad freight cars. The crane rotates in a circle and lifts bundles of logs. There is also a well preserved train station near this plant. The station could also be modeled. I hope one of you will be inspired to check out Metcalf and model it.

(From Sam Miller: The Metcalf mill was a favorite of Vernon Parramore. More than once, when we were returning from the Albany train show, Vernon would want to drive through Metcalf and see the mill.)
