Ed Schroeder's Spirits High After Leg Amputation; Wants to Resume Work on his HO Layout Soon From Sam Miller:

Control what you can control and then move on as best as you can. Ed Schroeder probably has operated with that philosophy his entire adult life, but, I think, especially now, following the below- knee amputation of his right leg.

Ed is learning to balance properly and walk safely with a prosthetic leg. He and his wife, Marietta, are having necessary, extensive renovations made to their Piedmont Drive area home. And, among other important priorities, he is impatient to return to work on his HO model railroad.

His layout is the New Orleans & North East Railway - not the New Orleans and Northeastern Railroad, which operated into New Orleans as part of the Southern Railway network, Ed emphasizes. He picked his name because "I grew up in New Orleans and Marietta grew up in the Northeast" and it was the name of a train which operated into London, England.

Osteomyelitis, a bone infection, required a below-knee amputation of his right leg in late July. Ed was provided a prosthetic lower leg about a week ago.



Ed has been treated for Type 1 diabetes since 1952. Thanks to doctors, Marietta, and personal discipline, he believes diabetes has been controlled successfully for decades. The Osteomyelitis could be related, although that is not clear, he says. Ed experienced Osteomyelitis in the past and amputation of several toes.

Disturbing symptoms began to appear again several months ago. He underwent a leg amputation operation at Tallahassee Memorial Regional Medical Center on July 26 and was hospitalized for two nights. He was transferred to a rehabilitation facility and stayed there 12 days. He received the prosthetic lower leg about a week ago and physical therapy at home is continuing.

"I am feeling well. I don't have my balance exactly yet," Ed says. "I am taking physical therapy to learn how to walk better and do things with the prosthesis. "This is the same learning process as with anything new like something complex in model railroading."

Ed has been working on his detail specific New Orleans-based layout for years, but he moved into some final stages earlier this year – with the help of several

BBMRA members, including HO coordinator Phil Weston, club Vice President Stacey Elliott, Neal Meadows, and Sheldon Harrison. The important medical issues intervened.

Ed wants to return to his model railroading objectives as quickly as possible. He has a couple of goals for the near future - being able to run trains when two grandsons visit from Boston at Christmas and wanting to be part of Andy Millott's BBMRA annual layout tour next spring.

Ed is another longtime member of the Big Bend Model Railroad Association. Like most of us, he loves real trains as well as model trains and he and Marietta have ridden trains throughout the world over the years. Ed is a retired professor of law at the Florida State University Law School and was director of the law school library. One of his best friends is Tom Hart, a retired professor of library science at FSU. Tom is a painter with art on display in town and is ready to paint skyboards for the New Orleans and North East Railway. "I told him he can't do that yet. We still have track to lay!" Ed says.

Barrett Johnson has Moved to Clarksville, TN Area

Barrett Johnson, long-time BBMRA member and friend, has moved to Kentucky, near Fort Campbell and in the Clarksville, TN, metropolitan area. Barrett has been a member of the Tallahassee model train club and the NMRA Sunshine Region for as long as I can remember.

Barrett was BBMRA president for at least a year or two. I think he succeeded me as president. He held several Sunshine Region offices.

He helped arrange for DeVoe Moore, who was and is a friend, to allow the club to set up layouts at the new Antique Car Museum, an arrangement which worked out well for the club for several years. Barrett, John Sullenberger, Andy Zimmerman, and others also persuaded Moore to let the club hold its monthly meetings in part of the space of the old Antique Car Museum. Barrett was among the club's leaders who negotiated agreements for store front layouts in Tallahassee Mall and Governor's

Barrett was the club's liaison with the Local Boy Scout Council. Barrett, along with me and other club members taught the Boy Scout Railroading Merit Badge.

Professionally, Barrett has been an attorney and legislative lobbyist for the last several decades. He was a key figure in the lobbying which helped Florida State University win the "Mag Lab" in competition with 3M and the University of Minnesota. He provided legal advice to BBMRA on non-profit organization status issues.

Barrett has been seriously ill for the last several months, although he is recovering. He is living for the moment at an assisted living facility in Cadiz, Kentucky, a few miles over the Kentucky line from Clarksville. He was moved there by his daughter, Jennifer Carlan, who is a registered nurse in the hospital at Fort Campbell.

Jennifer and husband David Carlan are building a new house in Cadiz, which will include living quarters for Barrett and his wife, Merry Ann. Merry Ann designed their portion of the house, including, Barrett says adamantly, room for the HO model train layout he has been planning for years.

Merry Ann is still in Tallahassee preparing to sell their house and other property. She will join Barrett later this year.

Barrett has shipped all his trains to Kentucky. He is donating about three dozen books on railroading – real trains and train lines – to club members who want them. They are at my house. Please come by and take a few.

I visited Barrett two weeks ago during a trip with Linda Medlin, my wife, to see her family in Nashville. During that same trip, we went to Knoxville to see Maxine Mantooth, Roy's widow. We took Maxine to Louisville and southern Indiana across the Ohio River to stop at Roy's grave and visit with his sons Michael and Barry.
