



Memories of The Mighty Haag Circus and the Ringling Bros. & Barnum and Bailey Circus – Part 1 by: Neal Meadows, Ed.D.


I grew up in Marianna, Florida. Some of the events that I remember at this time of year in my preteen years were the County Fair in the Fall and the traveling Circus that would come to Marianna, usually in September, not long after school started. The circus was usually a one ring circus, sometimes two, with the usual animals and acts with clowns while the

calliope blared in the background.

As I reached my late teen years, I began working at my Dad's Auto Parts store located on Lafayette Street in Marianna. It was on the south side of Lafayette St, also known as Hwy 90. On the north side of the street the ground dropped off significantly into a flat area with pecan trees more than 20 feet to the bottom. One day a discussion came up about the property across the street. An incident that had happened in the early 1960s



involved one of the station wagons used by the outside salesmen for the company. They usually backed their vehicle up to the double doors on the front of the building for loading all their filled orders on their route. The vehicle mentioned was a 1957 Plymouth station wagon and if you might recall it had a push button transmission with a small lever for putting it park position. The driveway was probably a 20 degree decline toward the street. While loading one day the



transmission slipped out of park and the car rolled away

down the ramped area across four lanes of traffic on Hwy 90, up over the curb on the other side and plunged down the embankment standing up on the



front end of the car. That was a shock to see that happen. It was later retrieved by a wrecker but was totaled.

My father remarked that the area used to be a winter home to a traveling circus called The Mighty Haag Circus. At the

time there was no internet, cell phones, or any other way to readily find out about the circus history. In later years a shopping center was built on the parcel and I forgot about the Mighty Haag.

As an adult, I moved to Virginia for a few years in the early 1970s and worked for Montgomery Ward. I lived in Portsmouth which is across the Elizabeth River from Norfolk. An announcement of the Ringling Brothers & Barnum and Bailey Combined Shows caught my attention. It was held at the Scope Colosseum in Norfolk. I went to see it and was

very impressed with the size of the show with the three rings and the many acts to keep your attention all the time. I later moved back to Florida and did not have much opportunity to see the circus again.

As I grew my collection of n-scale models, I started collecting various cars decorated in the Ringling Brothers Circus theme. There were various models produced by several companies over the years. Micro-Trains started some of annual serial collections and I started collecting those. The circus traveled by rail across the country. When Ringling announced it was closing in 2017, I decided I needed to collect as many of the n-scale cars as possible before the manufacturers stopped making them. My collection grew significantly. Some of the series that had already been sold were hard to come by. Some took me months to see one to purchase.

I want to share in several parts some pictures of the models that I have and share some information about the two circuses that I described. I will start with pictures of the models, then about The Mighty Haag Circus, and finally about the Ringling Bros. & Barnum and Bailey Circus Combined Shows.

N & Z Billboard Series

Beginning in August 2009, Micro-Trains will release the first car in an all new series—the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey™ Billboard Series! This 12-month series will feature colorful representations of actual vintage posters that were used to promote Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey shows. Each poster will be displayed on freight cars! The series will include 11 freight cars, one locomotive and a caboose.



Posters were an essential promotional tool for the circus. They were posted by the advance crew all over town and often up to 20 miles outside of the community weeks before the circus arrived. Thousands of these colorful and detailed advertisements were produced for each show and would range from single sheet flyers to large billboards for vacant fields or large buildings. This collectible freight car series will celebrate 11 special *Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey* posters, so get ready...the show begins this August!





Billboard Car #1 Big Cats
This car depicts the tiger acts that patrons will be able to see. Ringling was always known for the Big Cats Acts.




Billboards Car #2 Multiple Acts

In the first half of the twentieth century Ringling Bros./Barnum & Bailey Circus had the largest exotic animal collection in the world. Created in the 1920's, this poster exemplifies the variety of exotic animals showcased in their famous shows.




Billboard Car #4 Women Acrobats

Billboard Car #5 Dancing Bears



Billboard Car #6 Chariot Race


The chariot race was a highlight of the circus adventure.

Billboard Car #7 Seal Acts



Seal Acts were always an audience favorite with barking, balancing and playing in the band, they have the center ring in this brilliantly bright billing.

Actors, Animals, & Clowns

This 40' Double-Sheathed Wood Reefer is painted brown and features a colorful representation of an actual Ringling Bros./Barnum & Bailey poster promoting their shows. The decoration is based on one of the first posters designed to announce the historic union of the Ringling Brothers Circus with that of Barnum & Bailey, which took place in 1919. It embodies three main elements of the circus, Beautiful Performers, Entertaining Clowns and Magnificent Animals.



Billboard Car #9 Train Cars of Wonder

This 40' Double-Sheathed Wood Reefer is painted brown and features a colorful representation of an actual Ringling Bros./Barnum & Bailey poster promoting their shows. This stunning poster boasts a train length of over 1 1/2 miles long containing 10,000 wonders from around the world. The mass numbers of train cars and the crowded unloading process clearly illustrates it was no small event when the circus came to town.
